



The team made thedoor to door visit of the houses of these villages and distributed food materials andmasks and also promised to help them in future if the dead lock caused by the lockdowncontinues. It was a real relief for the Aboriginal Korwa Tribe who resides either in theoutskirts of the mainstream villages or in the middle of the jungles. It was also revealed that some of the families of this socially, educationally and economically backwardprimitive tribal community were not having ration cards and not receiving ration fooditems.

The YRC of St. Xavier's College, Mahuadanr headed by the Principal of the College Dr. M. K. Jose and in collaboration with Carmel Hospital and the Department of Botany of St. Xavier's College conducted a blood test camp in Regain village of Mahuadanr subdivision on April 30, 2019 as part of the extension activities with the help of IQAC coordinator Sr. Kaslin Juliet and two medical Sisters Vandana and Jelsi. About 150 samples of blood were taken to check their blood group and hemoglobin. The finding of the study was that the hemoglobin level of the people was on the average; the Hp level varies from 7 to 13 which is only average. The villagers cooperated with the program and were happy that number of people came to know about their blood group as well as the hemoglobin level.

Outcome: The blood test camp successfully raised awareness about the importance of regular health check-ups and the significance of blood tests in preventive healthcare. Community members gained knowledge about the role of blood tests in early detection and management of health conditions.


Awareness Program on "Witch Hunting"







These were the goals discussed in the program and focus was given:



Outcome: The primary outcome is to increase in the green cover in Beltoli. Planting trees contributes to a visually appealing environment and provides various environmental benefits.







Tying Rakhi to Trees



of various food products like wood, Tendu leaves, Mahua flowers and seeds. Fr. also focused on clean drinking water. Fr. advised then to boil water before using it.



Home-made hand wash liquid


