Faculty Development Programme had various sub-topics related to Main theme and these topics were discussed in detail by eminent educationists and a very beneficial academic environment was experienced by the participants. Dr. Anil Kumar Tete discussed the use of technology in Education. He also discussed the latest trends which are observed in various Institutes and the perception of teachers regarding the same. The lecture was very beneficial and provided an insight on the various challenges associated, which a teacher educator has to overcome. Dr. Pyari Kujur talked about research in Education. There were exchange of ideas on the issues concerning the educational researches. There was also a discussion on the requirement of the educational scenario and how research activities can be carried out by teachers in limited time span and with limited resources. Resource Persons: Dr. Emasushan Minj & Asst. Prof. Zafer

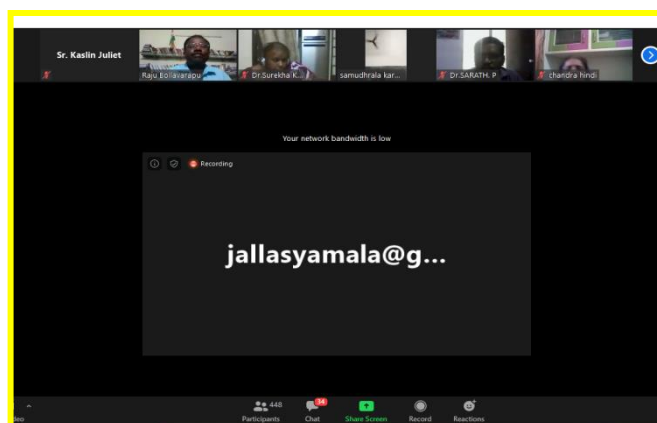

This course was aimed for teachers who are teaching various disciplines of science. The main objective was to create curiosity on pedagogical approach in teaching among the participants. Dr. Emasushan Minj spoke on advances in liquid fuel generation from biomass. The deliberation focused on the recent work related to catalysis development for bio-diesel production and algal biofuel. Prof. Zafer spoke on Renewable Energy and Sustainability. This session focused on the relationship between the access to energy through renewable energy base systems with the sustainability. He guided the participants to develop curriculum of their choice and also helped the participants to familiarize with the outcome base learning methodology. The various solar energy radiation measurement instruments and solar energy base systems were demonstrated to the participants. Participants also learned the measurement protocol of solar radiation and systems.

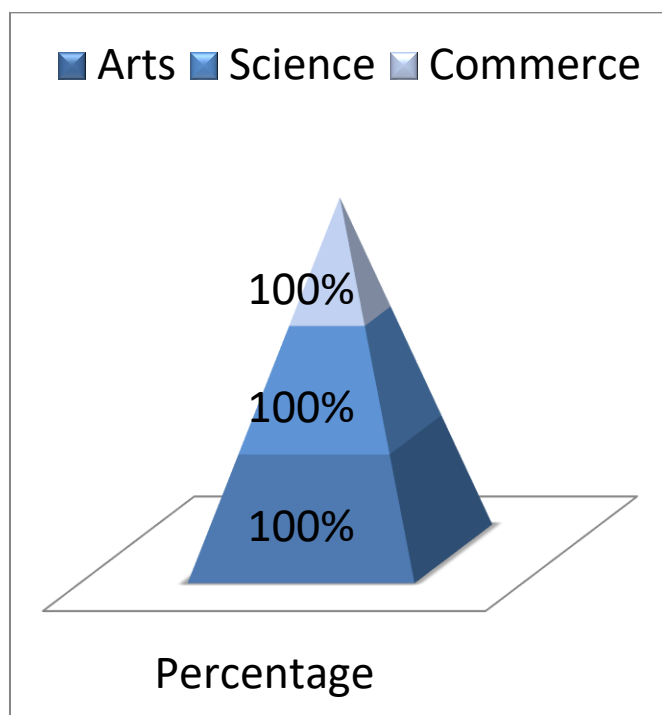

## IPR

### THE ART OF SEARCHING: NON-PATENT LITERATURE

One Day workshop on “The Art of Searching: Non-Patent Literature” was organized by Department of History on 26 July 2019. The resource person of the event was Mr. Deenmani Pandey. He broadly addressed the issue of conducting targeted search of databases for contextual information with special emphasis on approaches, strategies and methods. Stressing on

effective ways to mine required information early in research, he reiterated the need of mastering the ‘Art of Searching’ by the young researchers, taking examples from some of the subscribed and free non-patent databases available in the Library. With some practical examples he demonstrated how varying sets of information can be retrieved with different usage of punctuations along with the key words. Last part of the discussion was focussed on understanding the basis behind various Research Productivity Indicators provided by different citation databases like Web of Science, Scopus etc. He appraised the gathered audience about the actual mechanism with which such indices come up with the analysis and evaluation. He also discussed the importance of such indicators and how these tend to affect. Asst. Prof. Zafer discussed on the importance of choosing the right database for a specific search for obtaining optimum output. He highlighted the potential of the huge information contained in the sources and described how a proper search in the appropriate database can either fish out seemingly inaccessible information or help in identification of the library in the world that contains it.



### IMPORTANCE OF THE KNOWLEDGE OF COPYRIGHT IN ACADEMICS

A one day workshop on Importance of the knowledge of Copyright in academics was held in St. Xavier’s College on 8 August, 2019 by department of Economics. Dr. Sanjay Bara presentation entitled Copyright.....An Important Tool for Academics contained information about the concept of copyright, subject matters of copyright and their protection

period. He gave special emphasis on the use of others copyright materials during teaching and learning in academics. While saying so, he went on to tell about the special exemptions provided by law for academics and research in this regard. The concept of Fair Use of copyright, the most essential element of use of copyright materials was elaborately discussed with cases studies. A major issue discussed was digital copyright.

### **CREATING AN IPR ROADMAP**

On 9<sup>th</sup> August 2019 Department of Mathematics organized a Training program “Creating an IPR Roadmap” for the college. Fr. Dr. M. K. Jose S.J. emphasized on the process of setting up of IPR Cell in institutional level. He deliberated on the process of patent and copyright filing from IPR Cell.

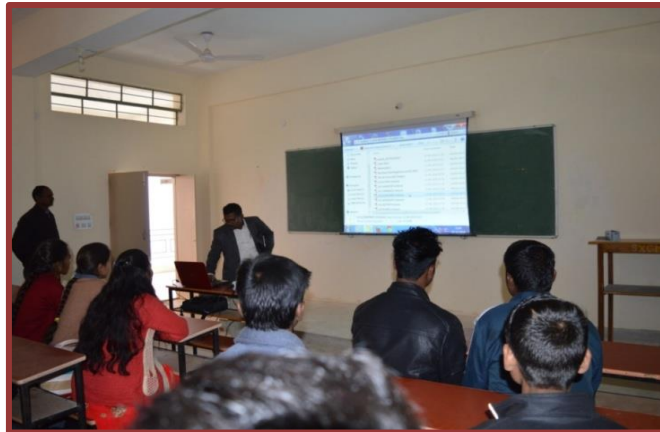


lice's presentation gave special emphasis on the different IPR courses implemented in undergraduate and stressed on the importance of such courses in academic.

### **PLANT VARIETY PROTECTION AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**



On December 20<sup>th</sup> 2019 IPR awareness program was organized by Department of Botany of St. Xavier's College, Mahuadanr. The theme of the program was Plant Variety protection and Intellectual Property Rights.



Dr. Ema Sushan Minj emphasized on the provisions laid down in the PPVFR Act. How and what can be called new plant variety, how farmers are given autonomy to many extent in producing and maintaining their crop varieties etc were discussed in details in this session. In this regards she also discussed the exemptions mentioned in the Act in relation to the use of protected varieties for the purpose of education and research in academic institutions and such kind.

### **CONTEMPORARY PHYSICS & THE ROLE OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

A workshop on “Contemporary Physics & the Role of Intellectual Property Rights, 2019” was held in the Conference Hall by Dept of Physics on 7 February, 2020. The workshop discussed the issues of possibilities of IP creation in areas like physics. The Principal sincerely emphasized on



the need of intellectual property knowledge in any academics for promotion and dissemination of the IPs created by the faculty. He opined that without adequate knowledge of patent literature many of the prolific inventions fail to get patent protection. Same in the case of other human creations that take place constantly in academic atmosphere. The participants were Faculty and Technical staff of St. Xavier’s College, Mahuadanr.

### **TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE, SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

On 10<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2019 Department of Political Science organized a two days Training

entitled “Traditional Knowledge, Socio-Economic Development and Intellectual Property Rights”. Rich in traditional knowledge, the communities of Jharkhand of India, over several years have



developed systems for the creation, transfer and preservation of their knowledge about various tribes. The event brought together different spheres of traditional knowledge system. The Training aimed to facilitate appropriate capacity building in dealing with the matters related to intellectual property protection in traditional knowledge for the overall growth and benefit of the communities in Jharkhand.

### **IPR ON FACILITATION OF INNOVATION AND COMMERCIALIZATION**

A one day outreach programme entitled ‘Facilitation of Innovation and Commercialization’ by Intellectual Property Rights was held by Department of Commerce on 29<sup>th</sup> February, 2020. The aim of this workshop was to build greater awareness and develop insights into the complex mechanism of creation, ownership and protection of Intellectual Property. The prime focus of the workshop was development of our society through multi pronged strategy of safe e-infrastructure, secured cyber space and powerful Knowledge network through the prevention of unauthorized access of stakeholders.

### **“INFORMATION ACCESS AND ANALYSIS IN THE INNOVATION AND RESEARCH VALUE CHAIN”**

One Day Webinar on “Information Access and Analysis in the Innovation and Research Value





Chain” was organized by Department of Geography on April 8<sup>th</sup> 2020 for the Staff and students of the College. The webinar was themed on Information Access and Analysis in the Innovation and Research Value Chain. The main aim behind organizing such a workshop, in addition to the annual Patent Search and Analysis workshop, was to give a hands-on exposure to the diverse information sources/databases that may be accessed in various subjects of interest in Science, Technology, Humanities and Languages etc. Fr. Gaudentius Kongari, who is one of pioneers and experts working in the field of information access and technologies, and Fr. P. J. James, deliberated speeches upon various topics. The topics of discussion ranged from the Art of Searching: Non-Patent Literature which covered broadly the issue of conducting targeted search of databases for contextual information with special emphasis on approaches, strategies and methods, to Access of E-Resources.

### **“INNOVATION –IMPROVING LIVES”**

Department of Chemistry celebrated the World Intellectual Property Day, on 26 April, 2020 with the theme “Innovation –Improving Lives”. The celebrations included a half day programme comprising of the IP Day Quiz, Best Innovative Idea Competition and Slogan writing competition relevant to Intellectual Property Rights. The event was organised in the Conference Hall of St. Xavier’s College, Mahuadanr with a gathering of students and faculty members from various departments. 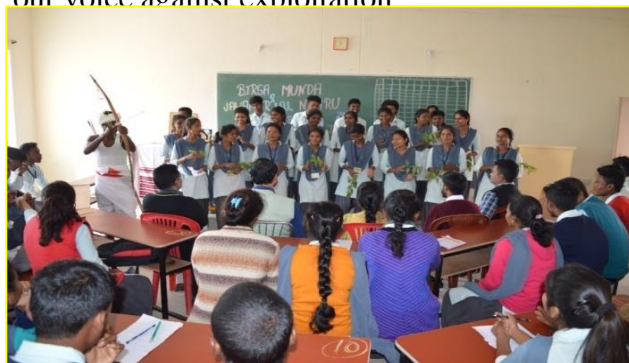

This message of the taskforce team was well received by the people. And this work was carried out from 7<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> April 2020.



**PREVENTION OF COVID-19 MISSION 2<sup>ND</sup>  
PHASE FEED THE HUNGRY**

The task force team purchased food materials and packed them in different bags to be taken to the identified needy villages from 17<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> April



2020. The team reached out to the most primitive aboriginal Korwa tribe of *Kurund Katal Toli, Sohar Path, Chhappi Path, Dathukhar, Injothkhar, Udalkhar, Myle, Baraiks* and *Lohars*. The team made the door to door visit of the houses of these villages and distributed food materials and masks and also promised to help them in future if the dead lock caused by the lockdown continues. It was a real relief for the Aboriginal Korwa Tribe who resides either in the outskirts of the mainstream villages or in the middle of the jungles. It was also revealed that some of the families of this socially, educationally and economically backward primitive tribal community were not having ration cards and not



receiving ration food items.
