The eminent resource person for this program was Prof. Dr. Ram Lakhan Singh, Vice Chancellor, Nilamber Pitamber University, Medininagar, Palamu. The honorable resource person addressed the faculty and talked about Covid-19, its challenges and problems faced by students and teachers during the Covid-19 pandemic. Prof. Dr Ram Lakhan Singh acknowledged and highlighted the achievements of the institution. He was extremely happy that the institution has progressed so well in a short period.

#### FDP ON RESEARCH DESIGN



The program was arranged by Assistant Professor Shephali Prakash and vote of thanks was given by Keerti Minj. This online program was attended by Professors of


all departments of St. Xavier's College Mahuadanr.

#### FDP ON PEDAGOGY IN TEACHING



Trademarks include twitter, Logo i.e. it protects logos, sounds, words, color, or symbols which are used by a company. He further explained that *Copyrights* law protects the rights of the creator of original works of intellectual



property. He also made students aware of the

violations of intellectual property consisting of infringement, counterfeiting, and misappropriation of trade secrets. The program was concluded by thanking and encouraging the students for patiently attending by the HoD himself.

#### RESTRICTION OF COPYING OTHERS' IDEAS

On 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2022, a short program on IPR was organized by the Department of English for students and professors. The short program began with the welcome speech by Asst. 

On 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2022, a departmental seminar was organized by the Department of Commerce. Asst



## PLANT NURSERY RAISING AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP








were facing severe health issues by showing the figure around the globe. During the program, Covid-19 safety measures were also taken. All the Professors and students were present in the program.

# INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY






On the

of two bullocks etc. Most of them were published in both Hindi and Urdu languages. His stories appeared in all the major Urdu and Hindi magazines of his era, Zamana, Saraswati, Madhuri, Maryada, Chand, Sudha etc. He also edited and published Hindi newspaper Jagran and literary magazine Hans. For this he bought Saraswati Press which later went into loss and had to be closed. Premchand came to Mumbai to write scripts for films and stayed there for about three years. Until the last days of his life, he was engaged in literary creation. Mahajani Civilization is considered to be his last essay, the Purpose of Literature as the last lecture, Shroud the last story, Godan as the last complete novel and Mangalsutra as the last incomplete novel.

The Head of the Department of Hindi, Dr. Vibha Alpana Kujur said that in the works of



Premchand, there is a clear depiction of the social effects of social reform movements, freedom struggle and progressive movements. On this occasion, Asst. Profs. Reema Renu Kandulna, Ahbay Sukut Dungdung, and the students of the Department of Hindi were present.

to keep the body fit. During summer many people fall sick because of not drinking enough water. The Hb level of more than 50 students and teaching and non teaching associates was measured. The measurements of around 150 students were taken for BMI calculation. The students with low BMI reading were advised to have balanced diet and the ones coming under overweight and obesity were advised to avoid junk food and imbalanced diet.
