



Assessing the Role of Educational Infrastructure Facilities Provided by Government and Private Sector in Improving Quality of Education with Special Reference to Mahuadanr Rajeep Kumar Tirkey* Rashmi Suman Toppo**Chandrodaya***Samir Toppo****

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Abstract

Nelson Mandela, speaking on the value of education said that education is the most powerful weapon that one could use to change the world. Education indeed is the solution for most of the social, political and economic issues. It also has the capacity to transform human life. However, a good infrastructure plays very significant role in imparting quality education. Thus, availability of proper educational infrastructure at educational institutions not only helps in the effective teaching learning process but it also contributes in improving the performance of teachers and students. Infrastructure includes the physical and human resources available in the school that directly or indirectly help the all-round development of the students. The present study was conducted under objectives, to study the educational infrastructure facilities provided by Government, Semi-Government and Public schools in Mahuadanr. A Survey method was adopted for this study. Questionnaire for Assessment of Infrastructure Facilities was prepared to collect the data from the nine schools in Mahuadanr.

Introduction

The educational institutes both government and private make sincere efforts to improve their education systems not only by providing quality education but also with a good infrastructure. The educational infrastructure facilities such as school building, ventilated and spacious classrooms, writing boards, computer labs, science labs, library with books from every area of study, modern technology and teaching aids, playgrounds and sports facility, CCTV, etc., play an important role in the all-round development of the students. The present study keeping these objectives studies the educational infrastructure facilities provided by Government, Semi-Government and Public schools in Mahuadanr.

Buckley, Schneider, and Shang in their work *Fix it and They Might Stay: School Facility Quality and Teacher Retention...*, stated that "infrastructure plays an important role in improving the quality of education" (Buckley, Schneider, and Shang, 2004), and in *Retaining Teachers of Color:* A *Pressing Problem and a Potential Strategy for 'Hard-to-Staff*, Betty,

Rodney, Ogawa, Dena and Casia assert that "the job satisfaction of teachers also partly depends on the school infrastructure facilities in which they working" (Betty A. Rodney, T. Ogawa, Dena S. and Casia F. 2010). Poor infrastructure facility at school affects the performance of teachers and Students as their interest, achievement and accountability depends on school infrastructure. Thus, the educational infrastructure of the school plays a significant role in imparting the quality education.

Statement of Problem

As school infrastructure plays very important role for both teachers and students in the teaching-learning process, the present study analyses the infrastructural facilities provided by the government, semi-government and public schools in Mahuadanr.

Definitions

Infrastructure Facilities: Infrastructure facilities include such as school buildings, ventilated and spacious classrooms, writing boards, computer labs, science labs, library with books from every area of study, modern technology and teaching aids, playgrounds and sports facility, CCTV, etc. to enable, sustain, or enhance quality education.

Objective of Study

To assess the role of educational infrastructure facilities provided by Government, Semi-Government and Public schools in improving quality of education with special reference to Mahuadanr.

Methodology

The Department of English, St. Xavier's College, Mahuadanr adopted the survey method to study the infrastructure facilities of nine schools only in Mahuadanr. The study is an explorative type of research based on primary data collected by survey method by administering questionnaire to school students and teachers through personal visit. So, a survey method was selected for collection of data. 9 schools were selected by the Department of English for the survey method and the teachers and students of these schools responded to the questionnaire.

Tool used for the Study

The students of English Hons prepared Questionnaire for assessment and personally visited 2 Government Schools, 5 Semi-Government schools and 2 public schools of Mahuadanr to gather the information of educational infrastructure facilities.

Delimitations of the study

- The study is conducted in high schools and +2 schools only.
- The area chosen for conducting the study was only at Mahuadanr

On the basis of data collected with the help of self-made questionnaire, an analysis was done and conclusion was drawn. An appropriate statistical treatment was given to the data collected.






Finding shows that most of the schools have library facility except one public school, which has no library.








Most of the schools have computer lab except one semi-government school, which has no computer lab.




Most of the Semi-Government schools have science labs where as one government school and one private school has no science lab.


Semi-Government schools provide high standard playgrounds whereas one government school and one public school have no playgrounds.








Most of the semi-government schools have sports facilities. One government school has no sports facility whereas public schools lack proper sports facilities.




Most of the schools use smart class/modern technology to impart quality education however, a government school; one semi-government school and one public school do not use smart class/modern technology to impart quality education






All the schools have their own campus and infrastructure except one public school which is running in a rented building.






